Main Attractions



The state of Terengganu is truly unmatched for its bountiful nature's gift and a state that is becoming more and more prominent in the hearts of locals and foreigners alike. It is well known for its interesting tourist destinations such as Redang Island, Perhentian Island, Kenyir Lake and its newest addition, the iconic Terengganu Drawbridge which is one of the main attractions in Terengganu.

Terengganu Drawbridge

Kuala Terengganu Drawbridge is the newest landmark in the capital of Terengganu, and the first of its kind in Southeast Asia. It was opened for public access on August 2019. The 638 metre bridge across Terengganu River's embouchure connects the city of Kuala Terengganu and Seberang Takir. The drawbridge displays a modern, striking architecture with the design of four of its 15 storey towers inspired by the Tower Bridge in London. At night, the structure is lit with colourful lights. If you're lucky, you can catch a glimpse of the double-leaf bascule opening up to make way for ships passing through.

Terengganu State Museum Complex

The State Museum Complex located in *Kampung Bukit Losong* hosts the original Inscribed Stone which was discovered in 1303 in *Kampung Buluh*, Hulu Terengganu. The discovery of the Inscribed Stone is proof that Terengganu is one of the earliest state that utilises Islamic Law. This Museum Complex is considered as one of the most beautiful from its architectural structure which was inspired from the old castle in Terengganu.

Within an area of 27 hectares, this museum complex also have a petroleum gallery, islamic gallery, traditional malay houses and two ships which are the *Kemajuan Ship* and the *Sabar Ship* which was once a symbol of pride for sailors back then.

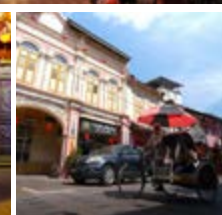
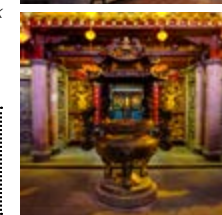
Chinatown (*Kampung Cina*)

Kampung Cina are actually rows of old buildings which was believed to be the home of chinese from mainland China which arrives to Peninsular Malaysia back in the 19th century. To this date, there are still building retaining their original woodcraft on their windows and large hardwood front doors whilst others are refurbished modern concrete buildings.

These centuries old buildings are now filled with shops, local coffee house, offices for tourist agencies, *batik* shops and souvenirs and etcetera.

Tengku Tengah Zaharah Mosque (Floating Mosque)

Tengku Tengah Zaharah Mosque or better known as *Masjid Terapung* (Floating Mosque) was named after the name of the mother of Al-Marhum Sultan Terengganu Sultan Mahmud Al-Muktafi Billah Shah which was the late Almarhumah Tengku Intan Zaharah binti Almarhum Tengku Setia Diraja Tengku Omar. This mosque displays the uniqueness of its architectural beauty atop Ibai river's estuary making it the most magnificent mosque in Malaysia.

Pulau Sekati is located near *Kampung Paloh* and Terengganu State Museum. A bridge spanning almost 1.5 km connecting *Kampung Teluk Pasu* and *Losong*. This is a perfect location for a little sunset photoshoot.

Pulau Duyong

Is an island on the Terengganu river estuary. *Pulau Duyong* is located near the city of Kuala Terengganu and is connected with the Sultan Mahmud Bridge which is the main road between the cities and districts of northern Kuala Terengganu. It is also well known for its artisanal skills in boat making for centuries.

Food

Nasi Dagang

Nasi Dagang Terengganu is usually made from a mixture of rice and glutinous rice and cooked with coconut milk, it is eaten with tuna fish curry and cucumber *achar* is also prepared as a condiment.



Ketupat Sotong

Squid is filled with glutinous rice and coconut milk gravy mixed with ingredients such as ginger slices, fenugreek, onion and a little salt and sugar for taste.



Ikan Celup Tepung (ICT)

Using fresh seafood such as shrimp, squid, and fish. The flour used also plays an important role in ensuring that the menu will be crispy and delicious. One of the most popular locations for battered fish is in Pandak Beach.



Culture

Terengganu is filled with unique arts, cultures and centuries old heritages. Till this day, its populace still holds dearly to their customs and cultural heritage and this is the thing that makes Terengganu unique and special.



Copper Crafts

Manufacture Copper is one of the famous handicrafts in Terengganu and represents a part of the culture and identity of traditional Malay society. The technique of making copper products is still maintained despite the use of some new equipment introduced. Most of the manufacturing process is still handmade with a certain method of mixing copper and alloys.



Batik

Terengganu is known as the largest producer of *batik*, from traditional versions of stamped sarongs to hand-painted *batik*. Painted *batik* is more western and liberal with the use of patterns and color mixing, traditionally inspired from the elements of nature.



Handicrafts

Terengganu is rich with interesting and beautiful handicrafts production. Usually the handicrafts recommended to visitors are rattles, woven mats, *mengkuang* bags and others.



Chinese Peranakan

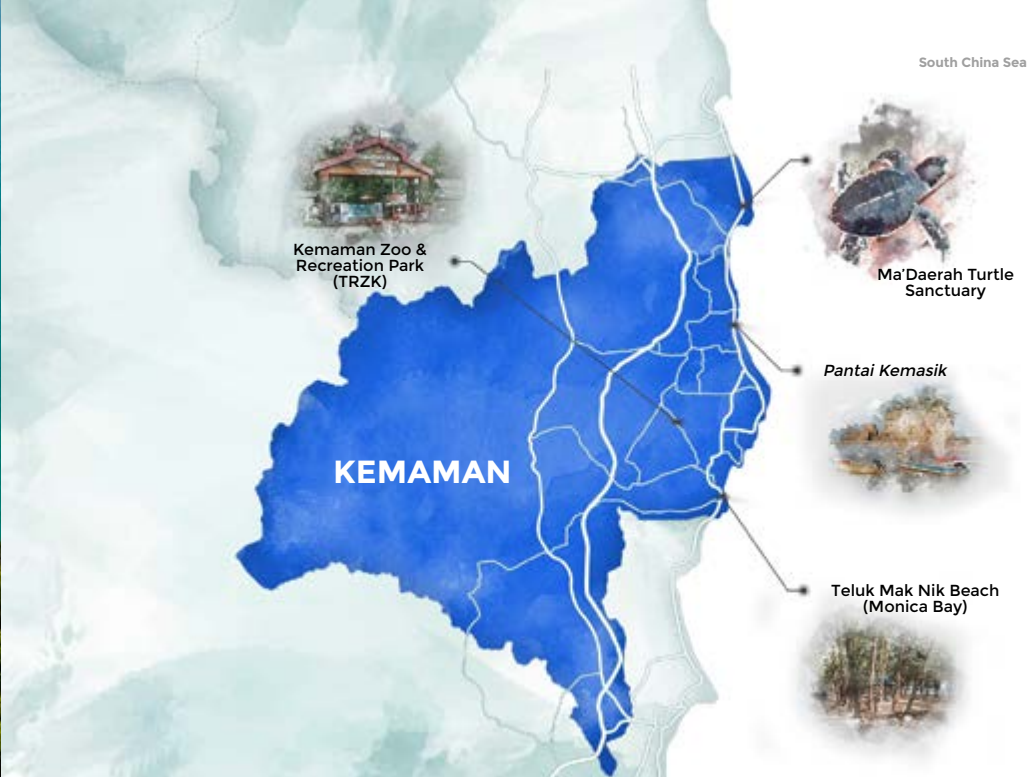
Better known as the 'Cheng Mua Lang' community or the community of "people wearing *kain*" (wrapped skirt), the Terengganu Chinese peranakan community is said to have existed since the 14th century, when Kuala Terengganu became the stopover for the emissary of the chinese Ming Dynasty, Admiral Zheng He or Cheng Ho between 1405 to 1433

These people communicate almost 70 percent of the time using Terengganu Malay dialect and speech through their daily conversation.

Kemaman is one of the districts in Terengganu which is located bordering the Dungun district in the north whilst bordering the state of Pahang in the south. Main Attractions

Pantai Kemasik

Its different natural formations from a group of "twin rocks" located by the water make this beach one of the most beautiful beaches. It has a pretty attractive area, a wide sandy beach with an indoor lagoon filled with seawater during high tide.

**Pantai Teluk Mak Nik (Monica Bay)**

Pantai Teluk Mak Nik is a focal location for turtles to lay their eggs that usually start from March to October. The most common species of turtle that climbs to *Pantai Teluk Mak Nik* is Agar Turtle or better known as Green Turtle. There are various facilities available on this beach making *Pantai Teluk Mak Nik* a suitable place to relax with friends and family.

Engku Haji Mahmud Mosque (Masjid Jambi)

This mosque was built in 1939, not long after the village was first established. The construction was done hand in hand by Engku Haji Mahmud and his followers. The prayer room in this mosque is able to accommodate about 500 worshipers at a time and serves as a place to teach the Quran, *fardhu ain* and *fardhu kifayah*.

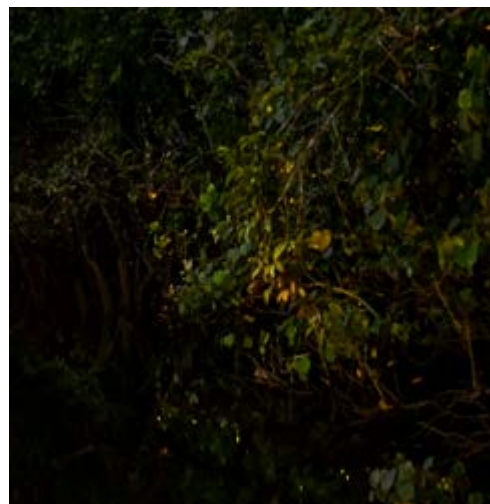

Fireflies of Yak Yah River

The fireflies of Yak Yah River or scientifically known as "Photuris Lucicrescens" (Lightning Bug), are the largest firefly habitat in Malaysia. Sungai Yak Yah is located about half an hour from Chukai, Terengganu. To see these fireflies, you need to take a boat ride on the Yak Yah River jetty. These fireflies are usually seen along the Yak Yah River by nightfall.

Bukit Harimau Menangis

Bukit Harimau Menangis in Kemasik, Terengganu is a fairly simple hill to climb. With a height of only 203 meters above sea level (666 feet), this hill is a popular location for recreation and is the highest hill in the western part of Kemasik.

Most of the villagers are third and fourth generations of pilgrims from the Hainan Archipelago, a territory located in Southern China after their ancestors came sailing in search of new settlements in Terengganu.

Lemang

For the locals on the East Coast, Kijal *lemang* is a must-have on their menus for its deliciousness. One of the famous location to sell these *lemang* is the 'Lemang Valley' in the town of Kijal.



Hai Peng Kopitiam

Kedai Kopi Hai Peng or Hai Peng Kopitiam in Kemaman, Terengganu is known for its aromatic coffee, wrapped *nasi dagang*, charcoal toasts and breads since 1940. Situated in the city of Chukai Kecil in Kemaman, the rustic atmosphere of the kopitiam oozes a unique kind of attraction.



Satar

Satar is a blend of scraped coconut meat, crushed fish meat mixed with chillies, onions, ginger and wrapped inside a banana leaf in the shape of a triangular pyramids. Each of the are loaded onto a bamboo stick and grilled on open flames.

Otak-otak are made from fish meat mixed with spices, wrapped in a coconut leaf and then grilled to perfection.

This restaurant is one of the most acclaimed restaurant in the city of Kemaman. One of the hot selling item in their menu is their stuffed crab.

Tenggol Island



Dungun is a district located in the central southern part of the state of Terengganu. It covers an area of about 1,018.4 square miles bordering the Kemaman district in the south and in the northern part it borders the Marang District. Meanwhile, Kuala Dungun is considered as the most important city which is the administrative center that houses almost all of the governmental sectors.

To-do-list in Dungun

1. Diving and snorkeling in Tenggol Island
2. Scaling the Chemerong and Berembun Mountain and a little picnic near the Langsir Waterfall
3. Explore the historical ruins of Bukit Besi
4. Pit stop at the Turtle Conservation & Information Center in Rantau Abang
5. Enjoy the scenic view on Pantai Teluk Bidara



Main Attractions



Tenggol Island

Is an island near the coast of Terengganu beach which is a very special place to be visited. This island only have one sandy beach side which is the one facing the mainland.

Tenggol Island is the southernmost island in Terengganu which is on the outskirts of Dungun beach. This island is a local hotspot for scuba diving because it is rich with reserved marine life. The discovery of shark whale also contributes to the Tenggol Island's reputation as a tourist destination.

Tasik Puteri Bukit Besi

Tasik Puteri or once known as *Tasik Bukit Besi* was an abandoned historical iron ore mine. It was one of the biggest iron ore mine in Southeast Asia. This lake is a man-made lake which is formed from damming the Besut River thus creating a reservoir.

Turtle Conservation & Information Center

This turtle information and management center serves as an information center on turtle research, hatching and management programs and is a landing place for turtles to lay their eggs. There are various species of turtles in this Conservation & Information Center, as well as visitors will have the opportunity to experience release of baby turtles into the sea.

Terrapins at *Kampung Delong*

Kampung Delong is the main location for this species of Northern River Terrapin (*Batagur Baska*) to lay eggs. Terrapins are not like turtles, because turtles lay eggs more than five times a year with more than 100 eggs, while terrapins only lay eggs in February and March with only about 40 eggs.

Bukit Tebuk, *Kg Nibong*

Bukit Tebuk which is located in *Kampung Nibong*, Dungun, is the first hill in *Malaya* to be drilled and turned into rail routes carrying iron ore through traditional villages from *Bukit Besi* to Port Sura to export iron ores abroad.

After the mining sector was shut down in 1971, railways were later replaced with roads to allow locals to use them as alternative routes.

Bukit Besi

Bukit Besi is located in the Dungun District was once a mining town a long time ago. Now, the remnants of the mining industry is still preserved within the city of *Bukit Besi*. There are a few historical artifacts that are still in display till this date such as chimneys, stock piles, washing plant/tin plant, crushing plant, explosive storage and parts of the living quarters are still in pristine conditions.

The Dungun District Museum building was built in 1941 atop the building of what was once the residence of a British advisor in Dungun. Some of the interesting antiques on display in the Dungun District Museum are artifacts taken from the Wanli shipwreck which was found outside the coast of Tanjung Jara in 1997.

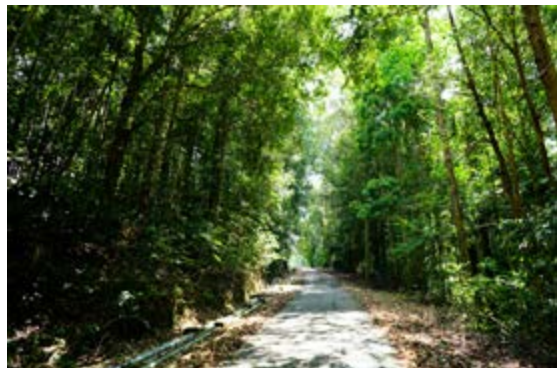

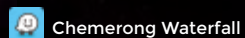

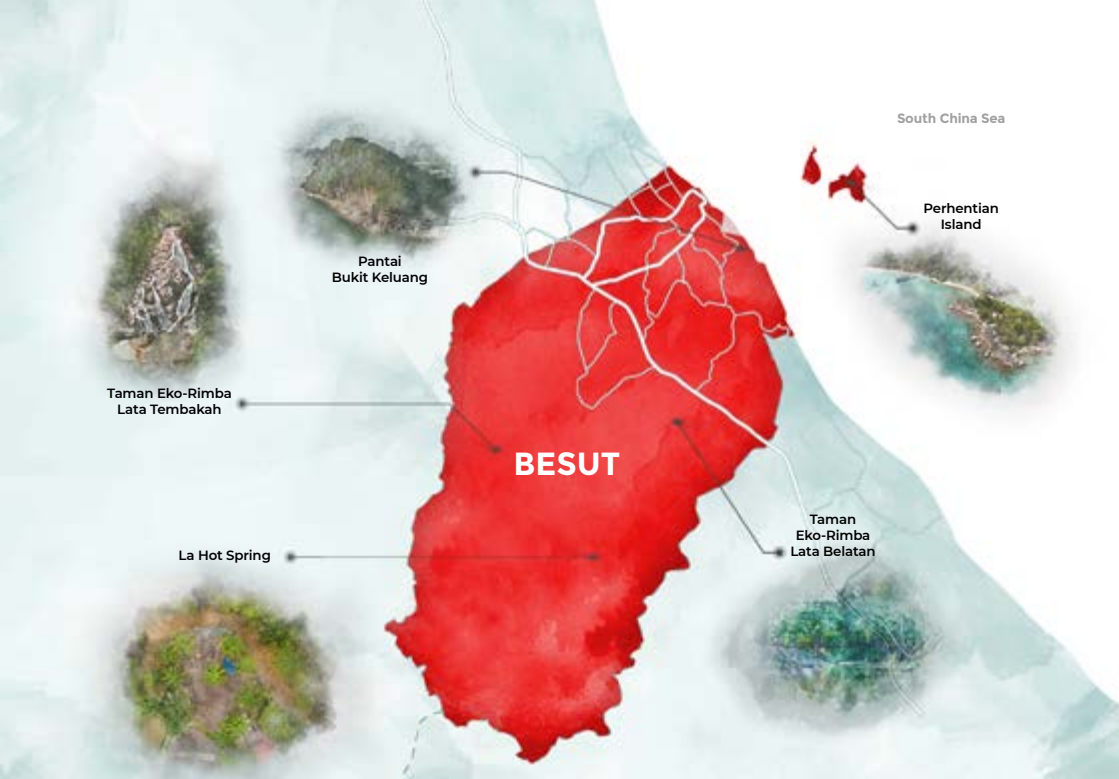

Dikir Barat



The *dikir barat* performance was never obscure anymore in Terengganu. *Dikir barat* is a performance presented in a group, and headed by a *Tukang Karut* and *Tok Juara*.

Both the *Tukang Karut* and *Tok Juara* will precede the singing while reciprocating poems, and then be followed by the group members as background voices with strong, loud voices.



Gasing Terbang

Gasing is a traditional Malay game that almost went extinct. Thus, for the people of Terengganu, the game of *gasing* is one of the cultural heritages that must be preserved.

In general, the difference between *gasing terbang* and traditional *gasing* is their measurements. A *gasing terbang* has a diameter of about 15 cm and weighs 4 kg. Other than that, a tin coil was included on the outer side of the *gasing* in order to give it the ideal weight for a much longer and balanced spin.



Wayang Kulit

The *wayang kulit* is a traditional theater art that employs the use of skin puppets and a white screen to form shadows from a light source. It became one of the popular entertainment a long time ago.

There are 45 different puppets controlled by a *Tok Dalang*, who also provides different voice intonations for each character.

Tonyoh Ubi Kayu

Serves as the most popular traditional food in Besut. It is made using a type of yellow-coloured tapioca and eaten with grated coconut. This food is the traditional food of the older generation.

The Hulu Terengganu District was proven to be the earliest location to accept the Islamic Religion in the Malay Land Peninsula according to records on the Inscribed Stones (*Batu Bersurat*) of Terengganu dated 1303 M (702 H) found in *Kampung Buloh*, Hulu Terengganu. In addition, the Hulu Terengganu District had been both a place of interest and where the scholars had taken residence as proven with the findings of ancient tombs like the Tomb of Tok Raja Ri in *Kampung Kuala Por*, Tomb of Tok Pauh in *Kampung Pauh*, Tomb of Tok Gajah in *Kampung Pasir Nering*, Tomb of Tok Berlian Mahmud in *Kampung Kemat*, Tomb of Tun Indera in *Kampung Kuala Por* and Tomb of Sharif Mohammad al-Baghdadi in *Kampung Jenagor*.

The Kenyir Lake is the largest man-made lake in Malaysia. Surrounded by 340 islands, the Kenyir Lake stores thousands of human civilization history and rich with the uniqueness and beauty of nature like no other.

Memorial Batu Bersurat

Memorial Batu Bersurat Terengganu served as evidence that the Islamic religion had already set foot here, and Terengganu is one of the earliest states that welcome the arrival of Islam. It was proof that the Islamic religion had already long been embraced and practiced in Terengganu. In other words, the validity of the date written on the Inscribed Stones, 4Rejab702Hijrah beingsimilar to22thofFebruary, 1303 was an important discovery in the history of human civilization in Terengganu.

Orchid Garden

Kelah Sanctuary

Located in Petang River, and takes about 45 minutes to get there from the Pengkalan Gawi Jetty. This lake has 91 channels, particularly from *Gunung Padang*, and was introduced for the protection, preservation and brooding of kelah fishes. It was right here that visitors get the opportunity to swim with the kelah fishes and have a taste of the experience of touching and being surrounded by thousands of kelah fishes at the same time.

Kenyir Elephant Conservation Village (KECV)

This Kenyir Elephant Conservation Village (KECV) is located in Telemong River, built in 2012 and covers an area of 256 hectares wide. Only 10 percent of the area was developed while the rest was never touched upon. The purpose of taking care of the 90 percent untouched area is to preserve the forest and maintain the "home" to the orphaned elephants that live within. Visitors who stop by at KECV are able to see the elephants in close range via both the hanging bridge and the specially-built tower.

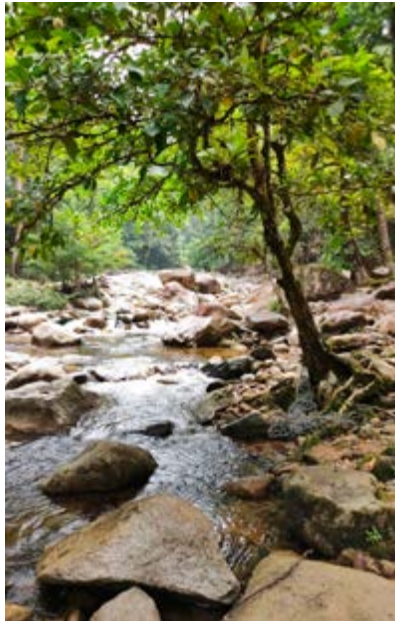




Taman Eko-Rimba Sekayu

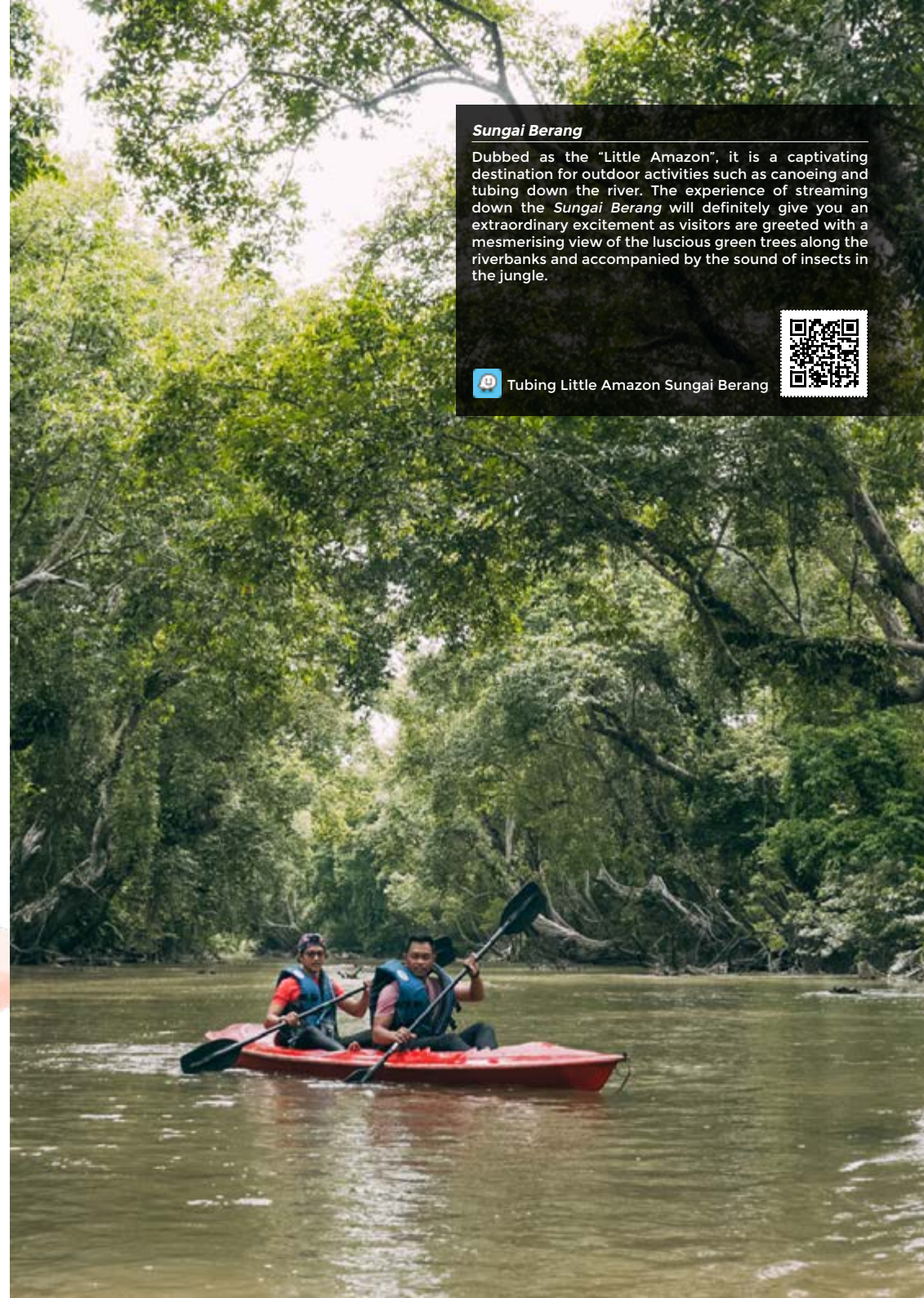

Gua Taat

Gua Taat is located near *Gua Bewah* and *Gua Batu Tok Bidan* in the corner of Tasik Kenyir, Hulu Terengganu. The cave can only be entered during the dry season which is when the lake is dry as the cave is submerged below the water and only a small part of it can be seen.

Gua Bewah

Gua Bewah is the biggest cave in Kenyir Lake, the entrance is situated 40 meters above the water surface. Visitors are able to witness the extraordinary natural formation of the stalactites and stalagmites in the cave. The interesting discovery inside the *Gua Bewah* which is a skeleton of a prehistoric human who is dubbed as "Bewah Man" and is believed to be the oldest human skeleton ever to be found across the country, as well as other primitive artifacts that were used during the Stone Ages such as pots, axes and other kitchen utensils.

Bukit Balik Hidung

Kertuk Hulu

Originally called *Gendang Batak*, this music instrument was played by local villagers during the arrival of Mat Kilau, a warrior from Pahang who came to stay in Hulu Terengganu. The Kertuk Hulu group consisted of 12 members but, however, only 10 were actively participating. The group who was led by the new generation of participants started to coordinate their performance and produced popular songs. However, they could only perform up to 10 songs at a time.



Dendang Anak Jenagor

Dendang Anak was already starting to lead various music concepts or genres, but clearly it was the name Dendang Anak that was synonymous with the rhythm of the music that it was proclaimed as the Nusantara rhythm, whereby there was a mix of traditional rhythm such as Jawa, Sunda, based off of tempos and music compositions which possessed the finesse that portrays the extensive or global Malaysian culture like *Zapin*, *Dikir Barat*, *Samaniyah* rhythm, *Inang*, *Masri*, *Gamelan*, *Joget*, *Pendeta* and many more.



Tumbuk Emping

Emping (flakes) is a type of traditional food that is made out of young rice and often made during harvesting season as the farmers' sign of gratefulness towards the agricultural product. Usually, the process making the Emping is done by women of the community cooperatively using a large wooden mortar and pestle. They will pound the rice until it becomes fine.



Silat Kura-Kura

Silat Kura-kura was originally performed in sandy places, whether it would be by the riverbank or by the beach. One of the interesting things about it is the design of the team's garment that is shaped like a tortoise's shell. Their performance is meant to look like a tortoise's movement which is slow with finesse, however, very meticulous.

Ikan Baung

"*Makan ikan baung di Kampung Baung*" (eat a mystus at the *Kampung Baung*) is a trademark of Kuala Berang, located around 40 km from Kuala Terengganu. Synonymous with its title as "The City Under The Lake", Kuala Berang is considered as freshwater fish heaven especially with its mystus.



Rojak Kateh

Known to be one of the most famous traditional dish in Terengganu, it is made with meat from a cow's legs that is boiled for a few hours and cut to small pieces before being cooked with peppered vinegar.



Bronok

It is a dessert that is made out of sago and sugar, then covered in grated coconut meat. It comes with two flavours, either plain sweet or palm sugar sweet.



Laksam

This dish is made out of rice flour and wheat flour shaped like a thick pasta that is rolled and sliced. It is only served with a white fish broth, and then mixed vegetables are a must that brings out the rich flavours of the *laksam*.



Laksa Kuah Putih

The *laksa* is made out of rice flour and is eaten with a white broth which consist of coconut milk and fish meat. A mix of vegetables such as cucumber slices and long beans are essential to accentuate the taste of the *Laksa Kuah Putih*. Chilli paste, shrimp paste and salt are added according to your personal preferences.

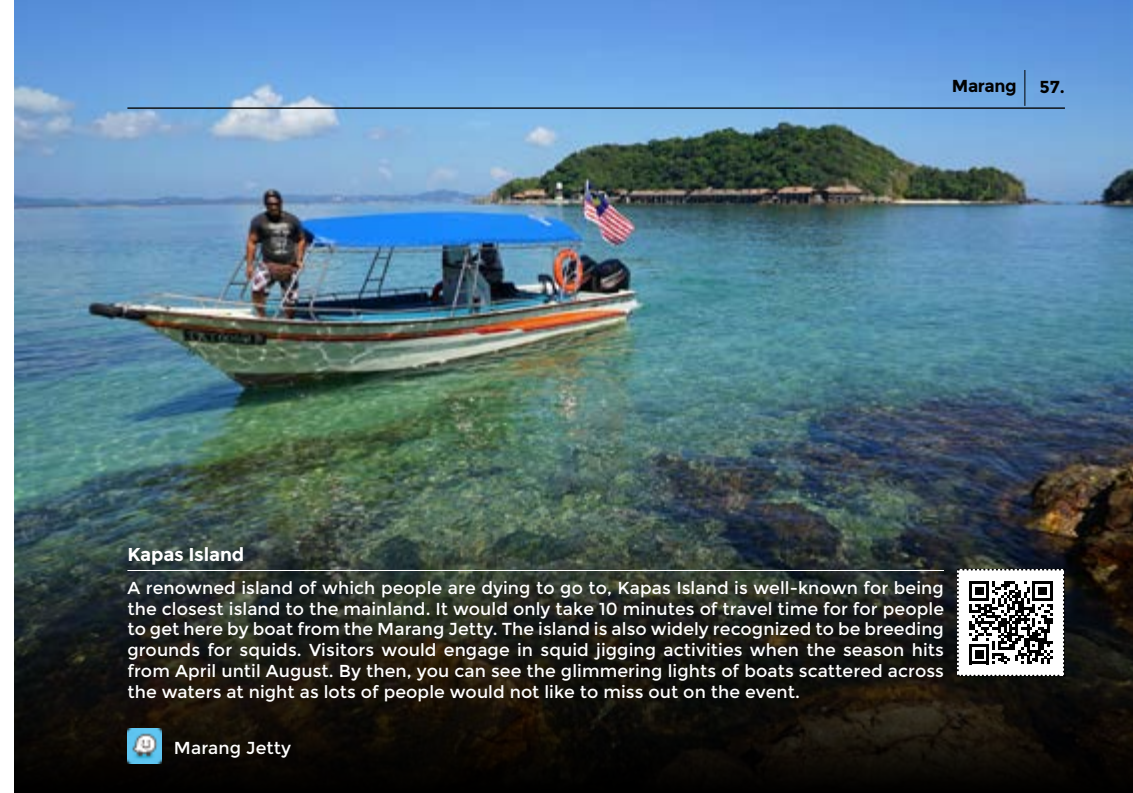


Pulau Kekabu

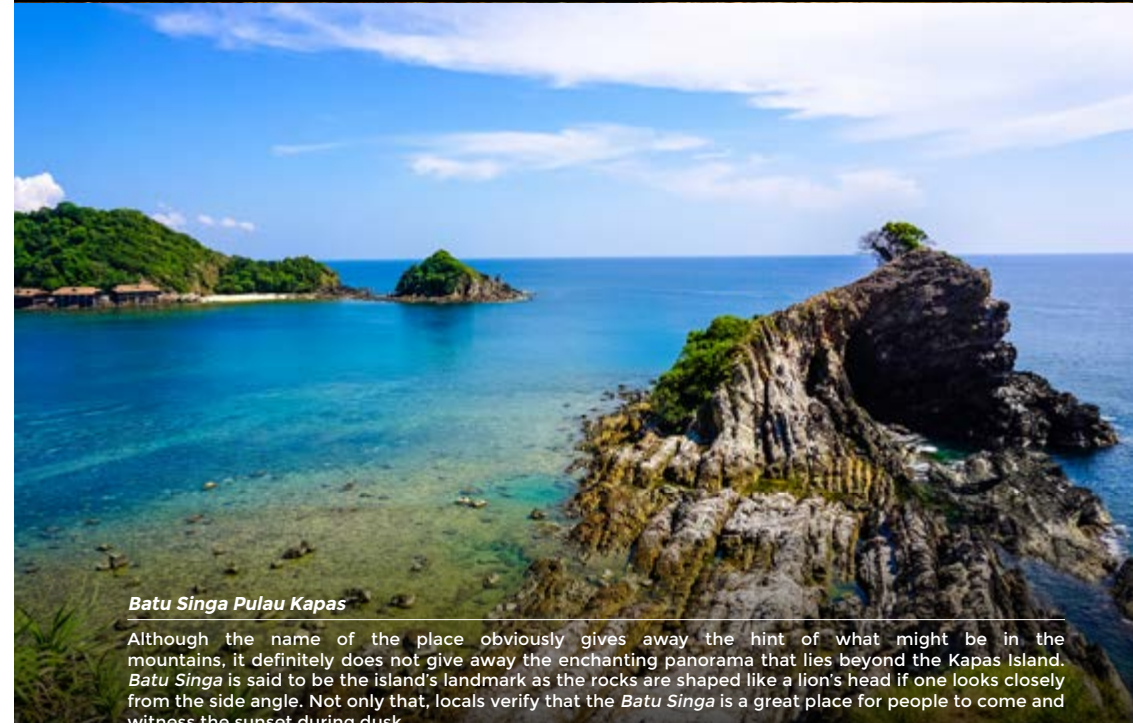


Kapas Island

Palm Sugar (*Nisan*)

Also known as '*Nisan Kerek*', here in Terengganu. The process of making palm sugar is very unique because the ingredients and technique used to make palm sugar are still the same as in the old days. The most important ingredients in producing palm sugar are *nira* juice and sugar. *Kampung Batangan* is the main producer of *nisan kerek* and visitors can observe how palm sugar is concocted by the villagers here.



Weaving Nipah Roof

Nipah leaf roof became a hot pick by many people due to its capability to cool down residence and making it cozier for a long period. Nipah palm is a type of palm plants that grow in mangroves or in areas that have low and high tide such as near the seaside. One of the mass producer of nipah leaf roof in Terengganu is *Kampung Jenang, Marang*.

Dodol Palas

Dodol Palas is a traditional food of Terengganu. Different from dodol of other state which usually wrapped in bigger size using plastic packaging, *dodol Terengganu* has its own distinctiveness.

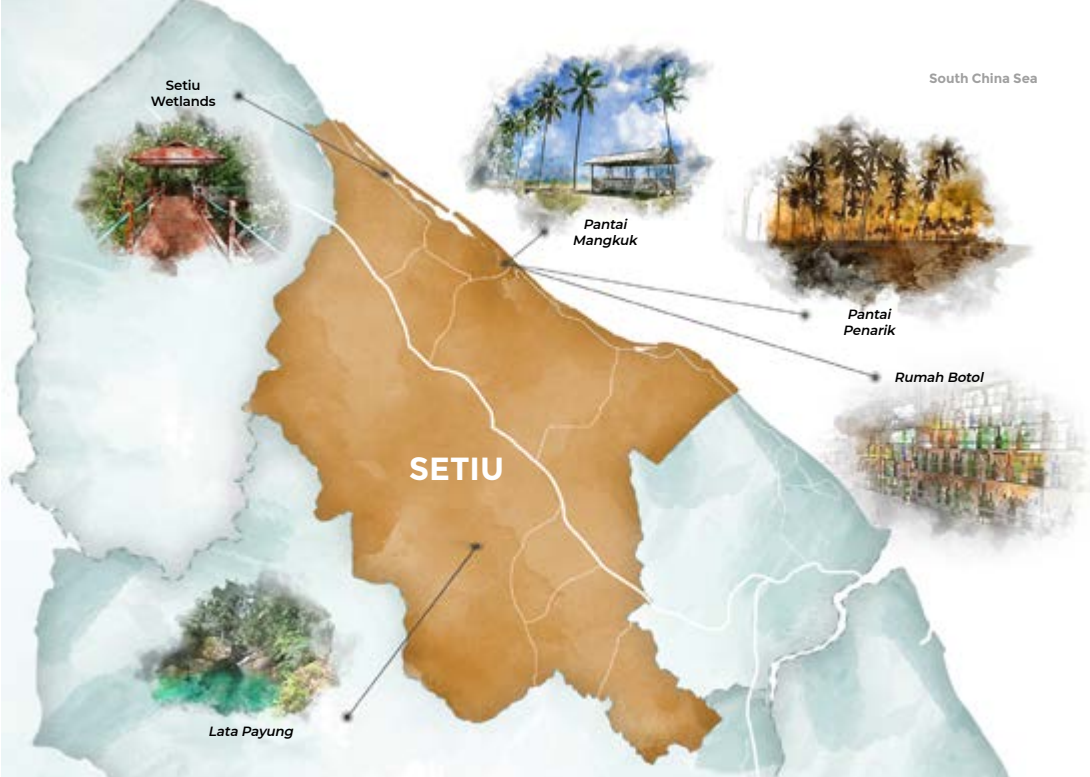


Corn and Nira Stalls

Apart from that, around the sides of *Gasing Terbang* also coiled with a layer of lead to give it an ideal weight, thus making it spins longer and more stable.

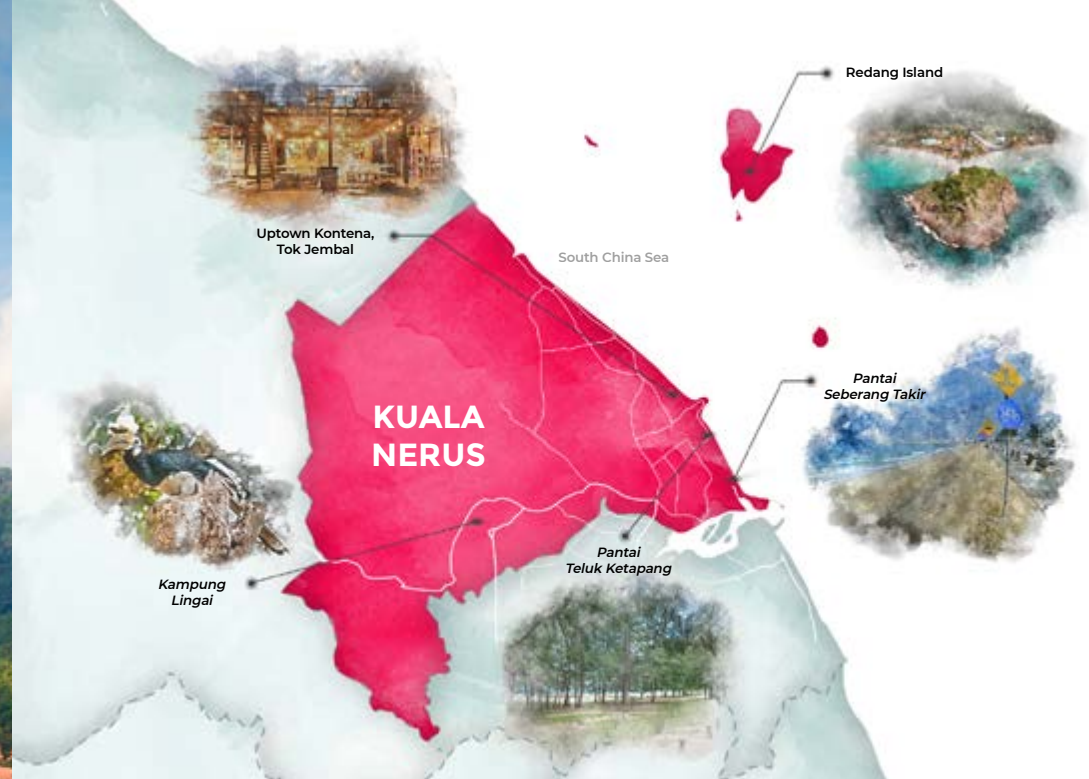
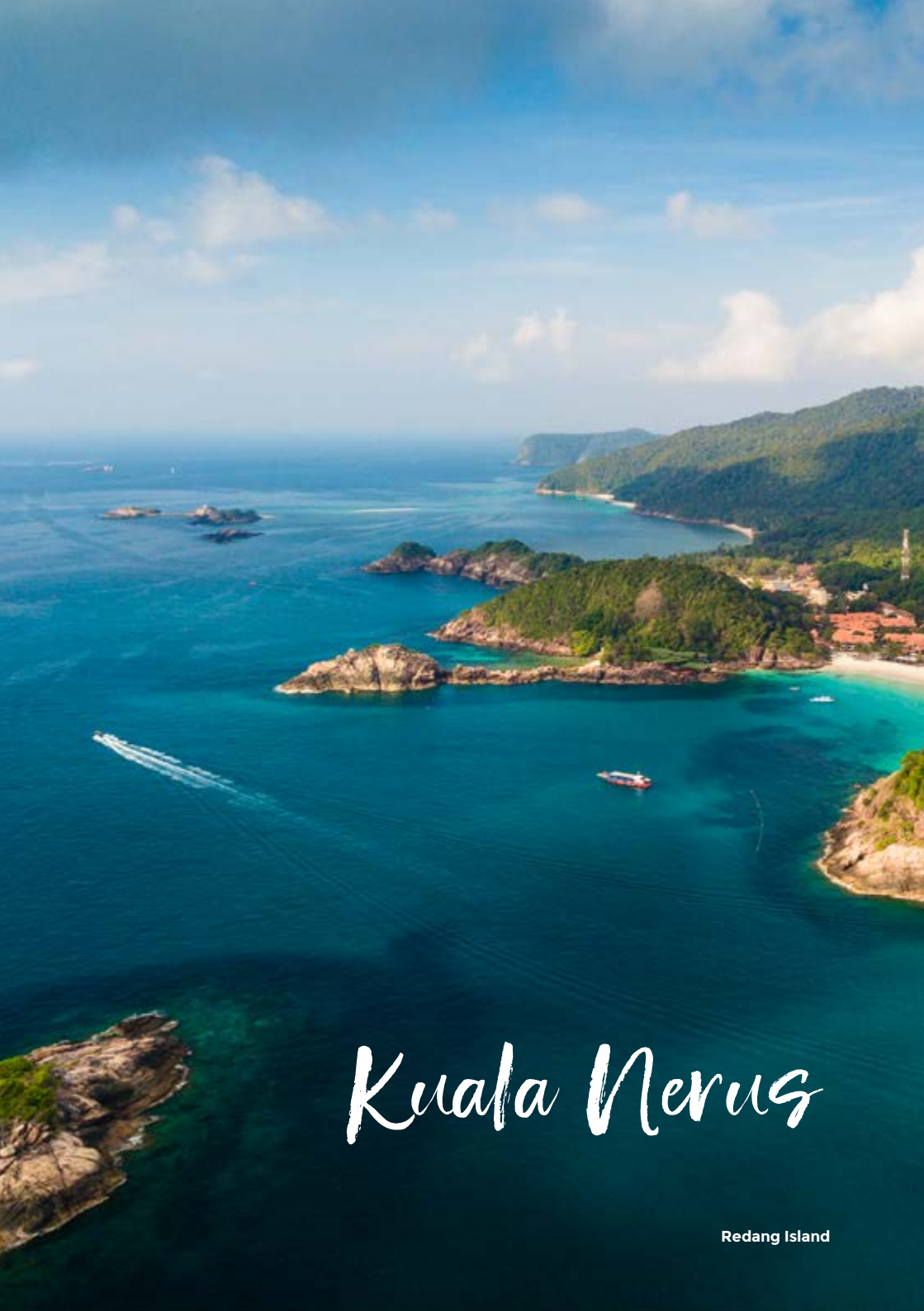
Weaving (Anyaman)

Gamelan



Performance art influenced by Malay, Javanese and Balinese elements that was brought to *Istana Terengganu* (Palace of Terengganu) by the royalties of Pahang. Tengku Ampuan Mariam who is wedded to the 14th Sultan of Terengganu, Sultan Sulaiman Badrul Alam Shah in 1913 is the one who introduced the Gamelan dance at *Istana Maziah* (Maziah Palace) in 1915. In the past, the *Gamelan* dance were performed only in the palace but as time passes it is now also performed in special events.



Gasing Pangkah

The *Gasing Pangkah* is a very popular game in many places and one of them is in Kuala Terengganu, particularly in Kuala Nerus. *Gasing Pangkah* is significantly different from other types of *gasing* (tops) based on its physical traits that is bigger in size, round and of course flat-shaped. The *gasing* is made from different types of woods such as *Meranti*, *Cengal*, *Merbau* and *KerANJI*. The types of woods in making a *gasing* must have the density and durability.



Silat Otar-otar

Silat Otar-Otar dance is a warrior dance originated from Terengganu. This dance is performed by male dancers only and in pair. The dancers wear Malay warrior costumes along with swords, the dancers also brought along a shield with small bells attached to it. Two lines of dancers will move while attacking each other accompanied by musical instruments such as *gong* and *gendang*.

Nasi Dagang

Nasi Dagang is a very famous traditional cuisine in Terengganu. Traditionally, *nasi dagang* is served as breakfast and on special celebrations such on the morning of Eid. This dish is an all-around famous cuisine and is served all the time.

Lompat Tikam

The phrase *lompat* (jump) and *tikam* (stab) are unrelated at all with this liked-by-many desert. Rice flour is used to make the first layer with an addition of pandan leaf to give it the green colour while the second layer consist of coconut milk. Traditional palm sugar is then added to give it a sweet taste.
